CONGRATULATIONS

Congratulations on being a finalist for our New Zealand National Finals Competition! This is an opportunity to meet and compete with Future Problem Solvers from around New Zealand to win an invitation to the International Conference finals in the USA next year! We hope you will share this exciting news with your Principal and school so they may join in celebrating your students' success.

TOPIC

The National Finals topic is Nanotechnology.

Saturday 8 November 2025 8.00am - 6.00pm

Except all Senior Competitions which will be held remotely: Friday, 24 October to Friday 31 October

PARTICIPATION

To maintain the integrity of the competition and to optimise social opportunities for our students, we expect that all finalists attend and compete at the one day event at either the Auckland or the Christchurch venue. However, if you can't reasonably travel to the venue and back within a day, you may apply through <u>Julie</u> to the National Administration Board for an exemption to compete remotely.

Senior competitors will all compete remotely during the competition window: Friday, 24 October to Friday 31 October.

If you have any other attendance concerns please contact Julie for exemptions that may be considered at the discretion of the Board.

COSTS

The costs per student are-

Global Issues \$150 + GST Remote \$135 + GST Creative Writing \$150 + GST Storytelling \$85 + GST

Payment is due by Friday 31 October, earlier if possible.

ONLINE REGISTRATION

Online registration forms MUST be completed and submitted by **4 pm Wednesday 15 October**, although earlier would be appreciated. The online registration forms can be accessed at this <u>link</u>. You can login using your regular credentials.

The members of your team(s) must be those who are named on the cover sheet of the Qualifying Problem. No extra students may attend. Up to 2 emergency substitutions are permitted but must be officially approved prior, so please contact Julie should this be necessary.

NB: The Farewell ceremony concludes by 6pm. Please do not leave before this.

Please report to the registration desk in the foyer on arrival.

SUPERVISION

We require two adults, **one of which must be the coach**, per school group, who will be responsible for the students whilst onsite. Other than this we understand that schools will comply with their own rules which will be informed by any RAMS/SAPS or similar they have to complete. Coaches of individual competitors should contact Julie to discuss supervision ratios for their students. Adults who are attending for the day need to be included in the registration form.

SAFETY and BEHAVIOUR

Whilst Future Problem Solving NZ will take every reasonable safety precaution towards your students' care, ultimately the responsibility for their safety, well-being and behaviour resides with your school's supervising adults. Each coach is responsible for following their school's procedures for school trips. Ensure that you have completed whatever your school may require in terms of permission slips, RAMS or SAPS or whatever your school might call it. Please make sure that you have (if possible) two contact numbers for family members or caregivers for each of your students.

If your school is asking parents to assist students with their Presentations, then the responsibility for any vetting resides with the school. Coaches must be responsible for any medical requirements of their students and should carry their own first aid kit.

We expect all students, coaches and visitors to respect the host school's property and grounds and to adhere to the boundaries which will be indicated at the Opening . Competition rules are outlined in the Competition Rules and Guidelines document.

GEAR and CLOTHING

Schools can decide whether they would like their competitors to wear uniform or smart casual clothing. Coaches, please be aware that no identifying clothing can be worn for Action Plan Presentations. Student must bring their own charged laptops – see Competition Rules and Guidelines document.

FOR THE OPENING CEREMONY

We want you to be part of our Virtual Opening Ceremony which will be shared across both venues! Please share with us something quirky and fun that tells us who you are. Wear a silly hat, do a funny walk, sing a song, make a flag, use an appropriate quote and show us something about yourselves. It

will need to be suitable for family viewing. This can be a photo, a series slides, a tiktok, or a short video etc. We don't want anything longer than 1 minute per school. We will need your contribution by 9am Monday 3 November.

Videos can be submitted via googledrive or other link sent via email.

Please avoid using copyrighted music or it will have to be muted. If you are using music it will need to be royalty free. For some inspiration, have a quick look at this:
